Icebergs vs. Ice cubes

Brothers, it is that season again when the majority of us will be getting ready to start our next year of school. There might be feelings of excitement, nervousness, expectance, anticipation, worry, or even dread. Whatever your mindset towards your academic endeavors is, I encourage you to go with the sentiments of Paul when he says, "In all things, give thanks." There are many people who would love to have the opportunities that you are having. It is truly a blessing from God to be able to matriculate into any college or university.

As you prepare your minds and make plans for school, I wonder how much preparing and planning you have put into your ministry. I am talking about AOT, but I am more so talking about your personal calling from God. What level of commitment have you been investing into the mission that God has laid on your heart? As I thought about commitment, I began to think about icebergs and how unyielding they are. Icebergs are very strong, firm, and mighty bodies of ice that break off of glaciers and sit in bodies of water. The Titanic could let you know that you do not want to be at an impasse with an iceberg because you will surely lose. What makes icebergs so dangerous is that approximately 90% of their bodies are beneath the surface, so it is very difficult to know how big they really are.

swayed by the forces surrounding me? Or am I fulfilling what Paul said in I Corinthians 15:58 being steadfast and immovable, always abounding. What's interesting is that a committed, iceberg person might look like an ice cube person because an iceberg person's commitment isn't always seen on the surface, but you will see that commitment once the opposition comes.

Are you committed to your calling or are you discouraged when the waves of life come and hit you? Are you only about surface level commitment or is your commitment deeply engrained? If you are not committed, you will most likely be worn out since there is no depth to you. Paul tells the Corinthians to be steadfast and immovable because they are faced with much opposition: sexual immorality, carnality, division, judgment, misunderstanding about the Gospel, etc. Not to mention the wiles of the evil one are coming against them. Paul wanted them to know that their labor was not in vain. He tells them that they have the victory in Christ Jesus (vs. 57) so they need to be steadfast and immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord.

I want you to know that as you prepare and plan your ministry goals, if you start to feel the pressures of it all, consider if you are an iceberg or an ice cube. If you are an ice cube, then I encourage you to change your posture to being an iceberg. You can make it through any strife, but you have to be steadfast, immovable. You have to be an iceberg. Be encouraged, your labor is not in vain...
